

Bullying and Disabilities


A child with a disability, such as hearing loss, language impairment, learning disabilities, or physical disabilities, is often at increased risk for bullying. Children who struggle to understand social cues or control impulsive physical behaviors are also at increased risk, as bullies may see this behavior as aggressive, prompting an aggressive response. Children with learning disabilities are also sometimes easy targets for theft and vandalism. In schools, teachers and volunteers should be aware of these extra risks and watch for red flags.

The Regina Coeli

Queen of Heaven, rejoice, alleluia.
For He, whom You did merit to bear, alleluia.
Has risen as He said, alleluia.
Pray for us to God, alleluia.

- V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia.
- R. For the Lord is truly risen, alleluia.

O God, who gave joy to the world through
the resurrection of thy Son,

The Rosary

Also called the *Psalter of the Blessed Virgin Mary*, the Rosary is one of the most excellent prayers to the Mother of God. Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary. These consist of a long series of invocations to Our Lady, which follow in a uniform rhythm, thereby creating a stream of prayer characterized by insistent praise and supplication.

Consecration and Entrustment to Mary

The Roman Pontiffs have frequently expressed appreciation for the pious practice of "Consecration to the Blessed Virgin Mary" and the formulas publicly used by them are well known.

The Brown Scapular and other Scapulars

The *Scapular* is an external sign of the filial relationship established between the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother and Queen of Mount Carmel, and the faithful who entrust themselves totally to Her protection, who have recourse to Her maternal intercession, who are mindful of the primacy of the spiritual life and the need for prayer.

Medals

These are witnesses of faith and a sign of veneration of the Holy Mother of God, as well as of trust in Her maternal protection. The Church blesses such objects of Marian devotion in the belief that "they help to remind the faithful of the love of God, and to increase trust in the Blessed Virgin Mary."

Mother's Day

Sunday, May 12th

Mother's Day began with a daughter who missed her mother and wished to remember her and to honor her. Anna Jarvis' mother died in 1905. With the assistance of John Wanamaker, (the Philadelphia merchant who opened the first department store in Philadelphia), Anna Jarvis arranged a small memorial service on May 12, 1907 at St. Andrew's Methodist Episcopal Church in Grafton, West Virginia where Anna's mother had taught Sunday School. The first "official" Mother's Day service was the following May 10, 1908 in the same church, accompanied by a larger ceremony in the auditorium at Wanamaker's store in Center City Philadelphia (then on Chestnut St., between 8th and 9th Streets). The next time you are in Philadelphia visit the former Wanamaker's store, now Macy's, at 13th and Market. Meet "under the eagle" and enjoy the noon organ concerts on the largest operational pipe organ in the world.

Anna Jarvis campaigned for a national Mother's Day. West Virginia was the first state to declare officially a Mother's Day in 1910. The rest of the states quickly followed and on May 8, 1914, the United States Congress passed a law designating the second Sunday of May as Mother's Day.

Carnations and Mother's Day go hand in hand. Anna Jarvis choose the carnation because it was her mother's favorite flower. Red carnations honor one's mother who is living and white carnations for one's mother who has died. Mother's Day is the day for us to thank God for our mothers, grandmothers, aunts, godmothers, the special women who nurtured us – to say thank you to our mothers still alive and to whisper a prayer of thanks to God for our mothers who have died.

Cinco de Mayo History

Cinco de Mayo is *not* Mexican Independence Day. Rather, Cinco de Mayo commemorates a single battle. In 1861, Benito Juárez was elected as the 26th – and first and only indigenous – president of Mexico. At the time, the country was in financial ruin after years of internal strife, and the new president was forced to default on debt payments to European governments.

In response, France, Britain and Spain sent naval forces to Veracruz, Mexico, demanding repayment. Britain and Spain negotiated with Mexico and withdrew their forces.

Emperor Napoleon III of France pounced upon a weakened Mexico to expand his empire. Late in 1861, a well-armed French fleet stormed Veracruz, landing a large force of troops and driving President Juárez and his government into retreat.

The Battle of Puebla

Certain that success would come swiftly, 6,000 French troops under General Charles Latrille de Lorencez set out to attack Puebla de Los Angeles, a small town about 75 miles southeast of Mexico City. Juárez rounded up a ragtag force of 2,000 loyal men—many of them either Indigenous Mexicans or of mixed ancestry—and sent them to Puebla.

The vastly outnumbered and poorly supplied Mexicans, led by Texas-born General Ignacio Zaragoza, fortified the town and prepared for the French assault. On May 5, 1862, Lorencez gathered his army—supported by heavy artillery—before the city of Puebla and led an assault.

The battle lasted from daybreak to early evening, and when the French finally retreated they had lost nearly 500 soldiers. Fewer than 100 Mexicans had been killed in the clash. Although not a major strategic win in the overall war against the French, Zaragoza's success at the Battle of Puebla on May 5 represented a great symbolic victory for the Mexican government and bolstered the resistance movement.

Austrian Archduke Ferdinand Maximilian, installed as Emperor of Mexico on April 10, 1864, was executed by the Mexican Republic on June 19, 1867. Puebla de Los Angeles was renamed for General Zaragoza, the formal name is now Heroica Puebla de Zaragoza.


Confusion With Mexican Independence Day

Cinco de Mayo is not Mexican Independence Day. Independence Day in Mexico (Día de la Independencia) is September 16, the anniversary of the revolutionary priest Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla's famous "Grito de Dolores" in the town of Dolores Hidalgo, Guanajuato, on September 16, 1810, a call to arms which, after 11 years of war, resulted in an independent Republic of Mexico.
