

## Holy Land Collection — Good Friday — April 03, 2026

After the last Crusaders were driven from Acre in 1291, much of the secular clergy in the Holy Land followed them. The only clergy who remained were the Franciscans, who were entrusted with the guardianship of the Churches and Christians of the Holy Land. So important was the work of the Franciscans, in 1622 Pope Gregory XV decreed that misdirecting alms bound for Holy Land was an excommunicable offense. Pope Urban VIII bound all prelates, under pain of mortal sin, that three collections were to be taken up each year in their dioceses for the Holy Land. Pope Innocent XI and Pope Alexander VIII issued similar decrees.

Pope Benedict XIII reduced the number of collections to two, and mandated that one be taken up in Advent and the other in Lent. He also imposed the obligation for bishops to report during their ad limina visits their actions for this matter. Pope Leo XIII, in his 1887 decree *Salvatoris ac Domini Nostri*, ruled that all bishops throughout the world were bound by holy obedience to take up a collection at least once a year on Good Friday, or some other day, to be delivered to the Custos of the Holy Land. Pope Paul VI issued the apostolic exhortation *Nobis in animo* in 1974, formally establishing the "Pro Terra Sancta" fund. The exhortation avoided a political slant and made no mention of the State of Israel but nonetheless spoke of the plight of Arab Christians. It reaffirmed the annual collection and added that it was not only for the maintenance of churches, but the "pastoral, charitable, educational, and social works" of the Church in the Holy Land, redirecting the focus from the upkeep of buildings to the Christian community in the Holy Land.

While anchored in the hope that comes from Jesus' resurrection, Catholics should not forget the "tears, despair and destruction everywhere" they have seen in images from the Middle East.

Every year on Good Friday, a collection is taken up in Catholic Churches to support the work of the Franciscans working in the Holy Land. Christians there rely heavily on the help that comes to them from this worldwide collection.

The Franciscan Monastery of the Holy Land in America is part of a world-wide network of Commissariats of the Holy Land which function as bridges between the Holy Land and Christians all over the world. The Franciscan Monastery in Washington, D.C., coordinates this vital support for the work of the Franciscans who work in the Holy Land.

The Franciscans of the Custody of the Holy Land have the unique responsibility to care for the Holy Places as well for the "Living Stones," the Christians living there. It is vital that we support Christians living in the Holy Land, to maintain a Christian presence in the very land made holy by the life, death and Resurrection of Jesus.

**Faith, Memory & Culture – The Holy Places:** Holy Land Franciscans and staff maintain the holy places and shrines. This enables those who live in the Holy Land and those who visit to deepen their faith, their spiritual, and cultural connection to salvation history.

**Social & Charitable Activities:** To assist Christians to remain in the Holy Land, including the poor and young couples, the Custody builds thousands of residential units. Additionally, they build senior care facilities. Medical assistance is provided for the needy.

**Educational & Scientific Activities:** The Franciscans operate and support schools open to all, regardless of religion or nationality. They provide scholarships for young men to answer the call to become Franciscan priests and brothers. Additionally, Franciscan archaeologists pursue ongoing research at the Holy Places.

**Pastoral Activities:** The Franciscans provide pastoral care in 29 parishes in the Holy Land offering worship, Christian formation, and necessary youth and family programs, especially in regions affected by war.

**Liturgical, Ecumenical and Communications Programs:** The Christian Media Center tells the story of the Holy Land through multi-media distributed throughout the world in more than seven languages. The friars organize liturgical celebrations for local Christians and pilgrims, and share with other Christian communities in the Holy Land in ongoing ecumenical cooperation.

## Our Elect and Our Candidates

*Our Catechumens, now our Elect*, are those who are not baptized and wish to enter our wonderful Catholic Faith. This desire of our Catechumens, now our Elect, is realized when he/she is re-born through Holy water and the Holy Spirit in the saving waters of Baptism, sealed with the Oil of Chrism in Confirmation, and then nourished with the Body and Blood of the Savior at the Easter Vigil.

*Our Candidates* are those who are baptized in another Christian community and who wish to make his/her Profession of Faith in the Catholic Church, are sealed with the Oil of Chrism in Confirmation, and then nourished with the Body and Blood of the Savior. Please keep a prayer for our Candidates: Andrew, Barbara, Jana, Jermayne, Michael, and Snow as they prepare for their Profession of Faith, Confirmation, and Holy Communion on Mother's Day.

### What are the Steps of Christian Initiation?

Prior to beginning the process of becoming a Christian, an individual comes to some knowledge of Jesus Christ, considers his or her relationship with Jesus Christ, and is usually attracted in some way to the Catholic Church. This period is known as the **Period of Evangelization and Pre-catechumenate**. For some, this process involves a long period of searching; for others, a shorter time. Often, contact with people of faith and a personal faith experience lead people to inquire about the Catholic Church. After a conversation with a priest or a parish director of Christian Initiation, the person, known as an "inquirer", may seek acceptance into the Order of Catechumens, through the Rite for Entrance. During this Rite, the inquirer stands amidst the parish community and states that he or she wants to become a baptized member of the Catholic Church. The parish assembly affirms this desire and the inquirer becomes a Catechumen.

The **Period of the Catechumenate** can last for as long as several years or for a shorter time. It depends on how the person is growing in faith, what questions they encounter along the way, and how God leads them on this journey. During this time, the Catechumens consider what God is saying to them in the Scriptures, what changes in their life they need to make to respond to God's inspiration and what Baptism in the Catholic Church means. When a Catechumen, the priest, and the parish team working with him or her believes, the person is ready to make a faith commitment to Jesus in the Catholic Church; the next step is the request for baptism and the celebration of the Rite of Election. Even before the Catechumens are baptized, they have a special relationship to the Church.

The **Rite of Election** includes the enrollment of names of all the Catechumens seeking baptism at the coming Easter Vigil. Typically, on the first Sunday of Lent, the Catechumens, their sponsors, and families gather at the Cathedral. The Catechumens publicly express their desire for baptism to the diocesan bishop. Their names are recorded in a book and they are called the Elect.

The days of Lent are the final **Period of Purification and Enlightenment** leading up to the Easter Vigil. Lent is a period of preparation marked by prayer, study and spiritual direction for the Elect, and prayers for them by the parish communities. The Elect receive the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Communion, during the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night. Once the Elect have received these three sacraments, they are now fully initiated into the Catholic Church.

## Lenten Devotions

- **Sunday Mass:** We have Anticipated Mass on Saturdays at 5:00 p.m. Our Sunday Mass is at 8:00 a.m., 10:00 a.m., and 12-noon. Sunday Mass is the foundation of our Catholic lives. Our presence at Sunday Mass is essential for our relationship with the living LORD and one another. Sunday Mass is God gathering us as God's holy people. Jesus' death on the cross was sufficient to atone for the sins of humanity. The Mass does not add to or replicate this event. Instead, the Mass connects the faithful to that one moment in history. This connection is not a physical re-enactment, but a spiritual and sacramental participation. The LORD invites us to unite ourselves to JESUS as JESUS offers Himself in perfect obedience to His Abba. It is our weekly supper as God's family at which the Lord speaks to us in the Scriptures and then nourishes us with the Bread of Heaven.
- **Daily Mass** is the daily devotion *par excellence*. Our daily Mass is at 8:15 a.m., Monday thru Saturday.
- **The Stations of the Cross** is a meditation on the Passion and Death of the LORD JESUS. We pray the Stations of the Cross at 7:00 the Friday evenings of Lent.
- **The Rosary**, the Liturgy of the Hours, reading the Bible are also excellent Lenten practices.
- **Practice the Corporal Works of Mercy:** To feed the hungry; To give drink to the thirsty; To clothe the naked; To shelter the homeless; To visit the sick; To visit the prisoner; To bury the dead. (Matthew 25)
- **Practice the Spiritual Works of Mercy:** To instruct the ignorant; To counsel the doubtful; To admonish sinners; To bear wrongs patiently; To forgive offences willingly; To comfort the afflicted; To pray for the living and the dead. (Isaiah 58, Hebrew 13)

As GOD's people, together we enter into the time-honored Biblical disciplines of prayer, fasting, and works of charity. While each of us will practice these three ancient disciplines in our own way, the desire is the same: To help us recapture the awareness that we depend upon GOD for everything; To remind us to share some of what we have with those less fortunate; To share in the daily hunger for food that so many in the world feel every day and to grow in the awareness that we are not alone, that we are members of GOD's family.


