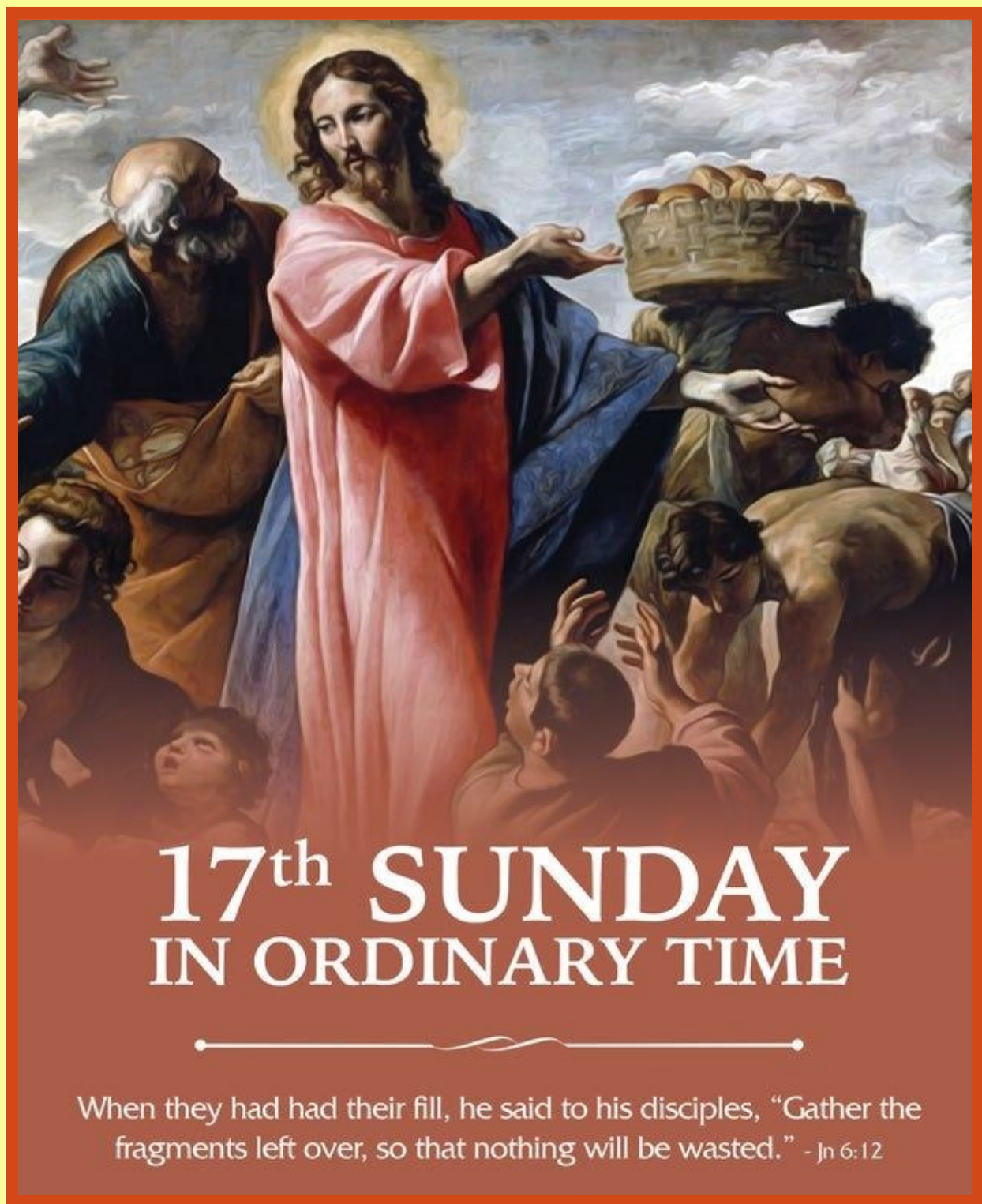

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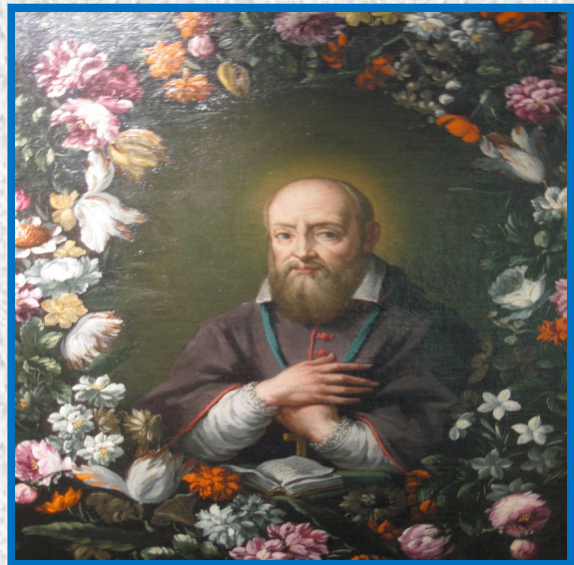

Christian Initiation of Adults, sometimes called OCIA, is an invitation to encounter the crucified and risen Lord Jesus through a new or renewed interest in private prayer, our public prayer (Sunday Mass) and study. By engaging in the prayer and worship life offered by the Catholic Church and through studying those truths revealed by Christ and handed down by the Apostles and their successors, our bishops, participants are invited to enter more deeply into a relationship with the LORD, the Most Holy Trinity.

Christian Initiation of Adults is the typical way that those who are interested to begin learning more about the Catholic Church, its prayers, teachings, and spirituality. It is an introduction to the Catholic understanding of GOD and creation and to the relationship into which GOD invites each of us, both with the LORD and with one another.

Adult Catholics who have not yet received the Sacrament of Confirmation or who simply want to learn more about their faith may also benefit from participating in OCIA.

### **Need for Lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion**

Your parish needs you to assist her as a lector or Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, especially at the Saturday after-noon 5:00 Mass and on the Sunday 12-noon Mass.

When the Church gathers to celebrate the Mass, or any other Sacrament, her members do not gather simply as a crowd, as an amorphous, undifferentiated group of people. They gather in a variety of ministries and roles. Baptism is our rebirth into the life of grace and into the life of the Church. In fact, the *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy* of the Second Vatican Council tells us that participation in the liturgy is the right and duty of all the baptized.

The first qualification, then, for any participant in the Celebration of the Eucharist is that he or she has been baptized into the Body of Christ, the Church. Each time the members of the Church gather to worship, they do so because their baptism demands this of them. After Baptism, then those who are Lectors or Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will have made First Holy Communion and Confirmation.

## St. James the Apostle

July 25<sup>th</sup>

### Camino de Santiago

After the Lord Jesus called St. Peter and his brother St. Andrew to be apostles, the Lord then called another set of brothers, St. James and his brother St. John. This St. James is termed “the Greater”(the first called) to distinguish from the other St. James the Apostle, St. James the Lesser (called second). St. James, the Greater we honor on July 25<sup>th</sup> and St. James, the Lesser we honor on May 3<sup>rd</sup> along with St. Philip.

St. James, the Greater is known throughout the world through the famous Camino de Santiago, the Way of St. James. Similar to our El Camino Real in California (the king’s way) – there is no one set route for the Camino. Some pilgrims begin from Sainte Jean Pied de Port in France, others from San Sebastian or Bilbao or Seville, Spain, others from Lisbon or Porto, Portugal. Whatever the route the pilgrims took, the pilgrimage begins when the pilgrims depart home to initiate the journey to Santiago de Compostella in the northwest corner of Spain. Here are three suggestions for contemporary insights of the Camino.

A humorous diary of the Camino is “Travels with My Donkey: One Man and His Ass on a Pilgrimage to Santiago” by Tim Moore. Here is a review. *“Having no knowledge of Spanish and even less about the care and feeding of donkeys, Tim Moore, Britain's indefatigable traveling Everyman, sets out on a pilgrimage to the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela with a donkey named Shinto as his companion. Armed only with a twelfth-century handbook to the route and expert advice on donkey management from Robert Louis Stevenson, Moore and his four-legged companion travel the ancient five-hundred-mile route from St. Jean Pied-de-Port, on the French side of the Pyrenees, to the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela which houses the remains of Spain's patron saint, St. James.”*

*Over sun-scorched highways, precipitous bridges, dirt paths shaded by leafy trees, and vineyards occasionally lashed by downpours, Moore and Shinto pass through some of northern Spain's oldest towns and cities in colorful company. Clearly more interested in Shinto than in Moore, their fellow walkers are an assortment of devout Christian pilgrims, New Age--spirituality seekers aspiring to be the next Shirley Maclaine, Baby Boomers contemplating middle age, and John Q. Public just out for a cheap, boozy sun-drenched outdoor holiday.”*

A more sobering depiction is the 2010 movie “The Way” follows an American father who walks the Camino to Santiago de Compostela after his son dies while making The Way. The film explores grief, self-discovery, the spiritual and physical challenges and the connections formed with fellow pilgrims, offering a vivid portrayal of Northern Spain’s landscapes and the pilgrimage experience.

A heart-warming and deeply moving narrative of the Camino is “I’ll Push You”, a beautiful story of friendship, devotion, learning from each other and facing adversity together. In book form published by Tyndal House 2017 and in documentary form “I’ll Push You: A Camino Journey of 500 Miles, Two Best Friends and One Wheelchair”.

“I’ll Push You” is the saga of two life-long best friends Justin Skeesuck and Patrick Gray making the Camino. Justin and Patrick were born two days apart in the same hospital in Eastern Oregon and were best men at each other’s wedding. Together, they embarked upon the Camino. So far, nothing out of the ordinary. Here is what sets their story apart from others. Justin has a rare and progressive auto-immune disease, Multifocal Acquired Motor Axonopathy, which selectively targets muscles in the body. By 2010, Justin was unable to move his upper and lower body.

Justin shared his dream with Patrick of making the Camino. Patrick didn’t ask how Justin, confined to a wheelchair, could possibly make the Camino. Rather, Patrick simply responded with these three poignant words, “I’ll push you.”

And so he did. Their Camino began in Sainte Jean Pied de Port, France.

A reinforced wheelchair was carefully fabricated to withstand the obstacles of the various surfaces of the Camino route they would face: dirt, rocks, mud, uneven and, up and down the hills. The entire Camino, Patrick pushed Justin, lifted Justin in and out of his wheelchair, in and out of bed, dressed and bathed Justin. Together they covered 500 miles in 35 days, through rugged terrain, many obstacles and challenges, they completed the Camino.

### What is the Camino de Santiago?

Also known as the Way of St. James, the Camino is a renowned pilgrimage of medieval origin that sees pilgrims’ journey to the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela in Galicia in the northwest of Spain.

Legend has it that the remains of the Apostle St. James the Great were buried in the Cathedral and discovered by a shepherd in the 9th century. The city of Santiago is named after St. James: Santiago de Compostela means St. James of the Field of Stars.

Due to the enduring popularity of the Camino de Santiago and the many Camino routes, they have been listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1993.

Why is the scallop shell a symbol of the Camino?

It is believed that the scallop shell became a symbol of the Camino because many pilgrims would walk beyond Santiago de Compostela to the coast (where the body of Saint James was said to have arrived by boat). Many pilgrims would pick up a shell on the beach as a token of proof that they had completed the journey. Today, most pilgrims tie a scallop shell to their bags to show that they are walking the Camino.

#### Pilgrim's Mass

The terminus for all routes of the Camino is the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela. A Pilgrim's Mass is offered twice a day at 12:00 noon and 7:30 pm. In previous times it was common for women to rest from the exertion of the Camino for several days on the mezzanine level in the cathedral while men would rest on the ground floor.

#### Botafumeiro

The Botafumeiro, is a huge thurible and is especially known for its swinging under the cathedral ceiling. The Santiago de Compostela Botafumeiro is one of the largest censers in the world, weighing 80 kg (176 pounds) and measuring 1.93 m (6.3 feet) in height. It is suspended from pulley mechanism 65 feet under the dome of the cathedral. It swings in a 210-foot arc between the transepts. It swings in a 65-meter arc between the Azabachería and Praterias doorways at the ends of the transept. The Botafumeiro is especially celebrated for its swinging motion during special Masses. The botafumeiro can reach speeds of about 35 miles an hour. The Botafumeiro has been swinging during Mass in the cathedral since at least the 12th century. The Botafumeiro is carried and swung by eight men known as tiraboleiros in mauve capes.

There is no one reason for such a huge thurible, the Botafumeiro. One explanation is that the arriving pilgrims were tired and unwashed from a four to five-week steady walk. The incense would cover the odor of so many unwashed days. It was also believed that incense smoke had a prophylactic effect at the time of plagues and epidemics. And incense is the reminder – as the smoke arises so too do our prayers arise to God.

#### Mishaps with the Botafumeiro

Over the years, several accidents have occurred during the swinging of the Botafumeiro. Apparently at one time, the Botafumeiro was attached to the rope with a hook which sometimes became disconnected.

One of the most renowned accidents took place while Princess Catherine of Aragon was attending Mass in the cathedral. On July 25, 1499, on the Feast of St. James the Greater, when Mass was held in Princess Catherine's honor as she departed her native Spain to travel to England marry Prince Arthur of England, the Botafumeiro flew out of the cathedral through the Platerias high window. No one was reported to have been injured on this occasion. Arthur, Prince of Wales, married Princess Catherine in 1501 when he was 15. Six months later Arthur died. His parents, Henry VII and Elizabeth of York and her parents, Fernand of Aragon and Isabella of Castille, decided to wed Henry, Arthur's younger brother, the new heir, to Catherine. Prince Henry refused. Princess Catherine remained in England, in limbo, until Prince Henry became king in 1509, and suddenly announced he would marry Princess Catherine.

The ropes and other devices securing the Botafumeiro have also failed; on May 23, 1622, and more recently in 1925 and July 1937. In 1622, the Botafumeiro fell at the feet of the *tiraboleiros*. In July 1937, the cords holding the Botafumeiro failed again, and hot coals were spilled onto the floor. Current procedure is to attach the rope to the Botafumeiro with a set of sailor's knots.

- St. Bridget of Sweden (d. 1373) and her husband Ulf Gudmarsson (d. 1344)
- Lorenzo de Medici (d. 1492)
- St. Francis Xavier (d. 1552)
- St. Ignatius of Loyola (d. 1556)

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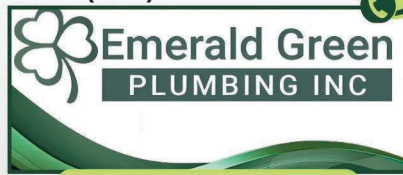
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
